### **Summer EI Benefits for Replacement Teachers**

Over the past few years, the NLTA has provided legal assistance to quite a number of teachers for EI appeals on the issue of summer benefits for replacement teachers who had accepted teaching contracts for the subsequent school year. The Employment Insurance Commission's initial decisions on eligibility and appeals to the Board of Referees and Umpire levels did not resolve the issue. The appeals that were heard resulted in inconsistent outcomes in cases that are, for the most part, based on very similar facts.

The NLTA, along with representatives from all provincial teachers' associations, is involved in efforts being made by the Canadian Teachers' Federation to develop a proposal to take to Human Resources and Development Canada to lobby for changes to policy and/or regulation that would provide a more fair and consistent approach to these types of cases.

### **Professional Development Alliance**

In May 2000 a report of the Ministerial Panel on Educational Delivery in the Classroom recommended that the Department of Education, school boards and the NLTA establish a Professional Development Alliance under a consortium model. The goals of an Alliance will include the development of a shared annual professional development agenda, a new model of professional institutes for teachers, alternate approaches to professional development and a system of recognizing participation in professional development activities. In an effort to build consensus around the work of the Alliance and to seek input on future action, a provincial symposium, Building a Professional Learning Community, will take place on October 2-4, 2002. NLTA will be represented at this Symposium.
