Collective Bargaining

Executive members provided updates on their Branch visitations regarding the Opening Proposals and any questions or feedback from the membership. In general there was positive feedback on the Opening Package but teachers want to wait to see what happens throughout the negotiation process. Based on discussions concerning the negotiation process, the following motion was passed by Provincial Executive:

A paper will be developed outlining and describing the spectrum of possible job actions available to the Association along with the pros and cons of each to be presented to the March Executive meeting for debate and discussion.

A focus group session took place at the Joint Council meeting to give Branch Presidents the opportunity to provide feedback on the Opening Package as well as to update them on the collective bargaining process to date.

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

Based on the research and reaction from teachers, the Association will oppose the Department of Education's proposed time allocations for primary grades

and this will be communicated formally to the Minister of Education.

The Association will request that the Minister of Education put in place an organized, well-devised plan of implementation to address the literacy issue, which considers the complex factors which contribute to literacy, and examines research to determine the variety of measures which must be taken to improve literacy. This plan should be a coordinated, comprehensive model developed through consultation with the NLTA and other partners. A recent issue of **President's Digest** addresses this issue in more detail.

Association Priorities

An updated copy of NLTA priorities for 2000-01 were provided to Provincial Executive and Joint Council, including an action update on all items. President Fred Andrews reviewed each of the priorities with Branch Presidents and gave a detailed update on the priorities, which are: concluding a collective agreement; quality of work life; classroom issues -- workload; membership involvement/identification with NLTA; and communications: internal/external relations -- building partnerships.

Pension Administration Issues

Provincial Executive discussed two issues arising out of the Pensions Administration Committee. The first of these concerned progress on a possible Interprovincial Reciprocal Transfer Agreement. At the present time a draft agreement is under consideration by pension plan administrators in all provinces. However, our provincial government has indicated it is unwilling to participate at the present time due to the current unfunded liability in the T.P.P. and the negative funding implications should there be a large number of requests for transfer of pension credits out of Newfoundland and Labrador. After discussion on this issue, Executive decided that the Association will support the position that the Teachers' Pension Plan will not, at this time, be a party to the Interprovincial Reciprocal Agreement. It was also decided that the Association will review and possibly revise its current policy on Interprovincial Transfer of Teachers' Pensions.

The issue of the CPP Integration Formula was also discussed by Executive, arising out of resolution 61 from BGM 1999. Following a discussion of detailed information provided by the TPP actuarial firm, Executive decided that it would not pursue further the issue of calculating CPP integration offsets on an individual basis. A detailed report on this issue will be provided to BGM 2001, in the **Report on Resolutions from BGM 1999**.
