

Executive Notes

Your Provincial Executive Council met on February 26 and February 27 in St. John's. A number of matters of importance and urgency to teachers were discussed. That meeting was followed by a meeting of Joint Council (Branch President and Executive) on February 27 and 28. In an effort to keep you more informed and up to date on the activities of Provincial Executive on your behalf, the following summary of major decisions made at the Executive meeting has been compiled.



Pensions/Negotiations

Executive will make a recommendation to Joint Council that the Negotiating Team be authorized to make and respond to proposals on pensions that could lead to a negotiated settlement on pensions as part of a full collective agreement. Positions of Administrative Responsibility

Teachers in Private Schools

In light of the amended references to Private Schools within the new Schools Act, necessary steps will be taken to investigate the possibility of having teachers in private schools represented by NLTA as a bargaining agent. CTF Defence Fund

The NLTA will contribute \$10,000 to the CTF Defence Fund with the specific provision that the monies be directed to the Ontario Teachers' Federation to help offset expenses related to the recent job action by Ontario teachers. Please contact President Brendan Doyle for further information.

Joint Council

The following amendments to the policy on Joint Council were presented to Joint Council for acceptance. (Joint Council approved these amendments.)

- I. Preamble - Joint Council shall be a body consisting of the members of the Provincial Executive Council and Branch Presidents all of whom have equal voting rights and responsibilities.
- II. Joint Council members are obligated to communicate to the membership the decisions, and the rationale for the decisions, made by Joint Council.
- III. The format of a branch meeting called to present a recommendation of Joint Council to the membership will be determined at the local level. Opportunity should be provided for the presentation and discussion of all pertinent information regarding the issue.
- IV.i) Members of Joint Council have a right to express dissenting views on any Association issue in accordance with the NLTA By-Laws and Code of Ethics but not when acting in their official capacity

as a Joint Council member.

ii) A Joint Council member who wishes to express a personal dissenting view of a decision of Joint Council shall not make the presentation of the Joint Council decision at his/her branch meeting where such decision is being relayed to the membership. Such presentation shall be made by the branch's Provincial Executive contact person or designate.

V. Communications between branches re Joint Council decisions shall be made at the branch president level and not through individual schools. Please contact Geralyn Costello, Assistant to the President, for further information.
