Association Priorities

QUALITY OF WORK LIFE

Provincial Executive were provided with an update on recent meetings with officials from the Department of Education. These meetings dealt with curriculum issues, student support services, testing, classroom management, and teacher workload. The main point made by NLTA at these meetings is that these issues have to be addressed immediately and that the problems will not go away until they are addressed. The obvious follow-up would have been a meeting with the new Minister of Education, Judy Foote. Due to the election call, however, this follow-up was not able to take place. When the election is over the President of NLTA will proceed with a meeting with the Minister. RESPONDING TO THE MEMBERSHIP

There are and will continue to be concerns from the membership on various issues and these will be addressed as time and resources permit. At the present time the Association is dealing with the call for a province-wide vote. A great deal of preparation was necessary for a motion from the Placentia Branch for a province-wide vote. This proposal involves extensive changes to NLTA by-laws which were discussed at length by both Provincial Executive and Joint Council. A detailed costing of operating a new governance system is being prepared and will be forwarded to branches prior to Convention 1999. Business from Standing Committees

This release time would be above and beyond the five professional development days referenced in the collective agreement. The NLTA By-law V. Subsection B will be brought to Convention '99 with the following proposed amendment: *Life members may attend and speak at meetings of the Association, but not at meetings or portions of meetings relating to collective bargaining. They shall not be entitled to hold office in the Association, nor vote, nor be members of the Executive. Other privileges may be granted as per Association Policy. The NLTA will contact the Department of Education requesting that a moratorium be placed on any reduction in teacher allocations, while a review of the current formula on teacher allocations is ongoing. NLTA will call for an immediate halt to further implementation of "Pathways to Programming and Graduation", pending provision of necessary professional and personnel supports and government acting upon the recommendations of the NLTA position paper, "The Crisis in Student Support". NLTA will take this position publicly through the media and in consultation with the Department of Education, the Newfoundland and Labrador School Boards Association, individual school boards and directors, the Federation of School Councils, social workers, and Department of Justice officials. NLTA will communicate its position and provide a copy of "The Crisis in Student Support" to all teachers and initiate a process to obtain feedback from teachers on this matter. In the event that the NLTA is unsuccessful in stopping the implementation of the "Pathways to Programming and Graduation", the NLTA President is empowered to call for an immediate halt when deemed necessary. For further information contact [Brendan Doyle](#), President.

A committee of NLTA will be given the mandate to investigate and make recommendations re: the concerns of teachers on new building construction and remodelling of old buildings and make recommendations on how to deal with these concerns. A set of minimum parameters will be developed for new school construction and these parameters will be communicated to communities targeted for new school construction.
