Collective Bargaining

The Collective Bargaining Committee has met twice and has been collecting information from teachers on the main issues/concerns they want addressed in the next round of bargaining. A series of letters and memos has gone out to all groups asking for input. To ensure that all teachers have the opportunity to provide input, the week of January 14 was set aside as [Collective Bargaining Submission Week](#). The submissions will assist the Collective Bargaining Committee in putting together a set of opening proposals in the coming months.

The Executive Director of Oxfam, Bill Hynd, was invited to the meeting for a timed session to brief Provincial Executive on the "Education Now" Campaign. He explained one of the greatest challenges facing the world today is the vast number of children who don't receive even the most basic education. The purpose of the campaign is to get children into school around the world. NLTA endorses the "Education Now: Break the Cycle of Poverty" campaign as initiated jointly by Oxfam and Education International. Pathways

On December 1, the Curriculum Committee met with Program Specialists from seven of the school districts and with representatives from the Division of Student Support Services. The meeting provided an opportunity for committee members to further articulate and clarify the NLTA's position regarding implementation of Pathways and presented an opportunity for dialogue among the groups.

Executive members were also provided with the results of the 638 questionnaires returned from teachers across the province. The major areas of concern with Pathways include: time requirements; lack of necessary professional development; trying to meet the diverse needs in the regular classroom; lack of support (programs and personnel) for Pathways 2 (remedial) children; lack of adequate personnel -- Special Education, Guidance, Educational Psychologist positions; legal liability in categorizing students and meeting their needs; missed opportunities for early intervention if children are not assessed until age 8; the time required to have children approved for categorical services, with time-consuming documentation sometimes being rejected by the Department of Education. The Association is continuing to pursue these issues at the provincial level. - Occasionally there are requests from teachers to access Professional Development funding for inservicing for new programs. This is clearly the responsibility of the employer. A letter will be distributed to school districts to remind boards that NLTA funding covers personal professional growth and that inservice funding should be the responsibility of the Department of Education and School Districts.
