Collective Bargaining

Executive devoted a great deal of time to reviewing all articles of the opening proposals for the current round of collective bargaining. Detailed presentations and discussion took place during an information session which included a report from the negotiating team, a review of the collective bargaining process, a review of information for branch presentations and a discussion session on "negotiations in context". Copies of the opening proposals, which include proposals from the employer, are being sent to all schools. Branch meetings will be held to discuss the opening proposals. Proposed Policy and By-law Changes

Executive reviewed motions and notice of motion for by-law changes to be dealt with at the upcoming Convention. Sixteen proposed changes to the NLTA Act and by-laws met the voting requirements for the 2001 BGM. Five of these proposals result from resolutions submitted by branches to the 1999 BGM which did not satisfy the required notice of three months for by-law changes in order to be voted on at that meeting.

Task Force on Workers' Compensation System

The provincial government recently appointed a Task Force to review current financial circumstances associated with the Workers' Compensation system in Newfoundland and Labrador. The NLTA was invited to make a submission to the Task Force as well as participate in a Round Table discussion. On January 18, a brief from the NLTA was presented to the Task Force. Follow-up discussions are scheduled for January 25.

A committee is in the process of being appointed to pursue the carrying out of the workload study under Schedule P -- Workload of the current collective agreement. Pension Administration Issues

Provincial Executive received an update on two issues arising out of discussions in the Pensions Administration Committee. The first of these

concerned progress on a possible Interprovincial Reciprocal Transfer Agreement. At the present time a draft agreement is under consideration by pension plan administrators in all provinces. However, our provincial government has indicated it is unwilling to participate at the present time due to the current unfunded liability in the T.P.P. and the negative funding implications should there be a large number of requests for transfer of pension credits out of Newfoundland and Labrador. The CPP Integration Formula was also discussed by Executive with detailed information and an update being provided for their perusal. Since Executive wished to have further time to review the detailed information on both topics, further discussion was tabled until the February Executive meeting.
