ISSP/Pathways Commission Report

Provincial Executive reviewed the ISSP/Pathways Commission Report as well as a draft response from the NLTA to the Report. A recommendation-by-recommendation analysis of the Commission Report was prepared by Lloyd Hobbs, Assistant Executive Director and George Tucker, Administrative Officer in the Professional Development Division,

for the review of Provincial Executive. The analysis was based on the NLTA's original input to the Commission. Feedback and comments from Provincial Executive will be incorporated into the final document as the formal response to the ISSP/Pathways Commission Report.

A timed session took place with Dr. Marian Fushell, Assistant Deputy Minister (Primary, Elementary and Secondary Education), and Dr. Darin King, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Education, from the Department of Education. Provincial Executive had the opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback and comments on the Commission Report, and other topics.

Membership Benefits and Services

- Section a) iii) of the nomination procedures for the Bancroft Award and section a) ii) of the nomination procedures for the Allan Bishop Award will be amended by adding the following subsection: "The names and addresses of two individuals who would be able to provide references concerning the nomination. These could be the names of current or former officers of the branch or a branch member who is familiar with the nominee's achievements."
- Section VII – Duties and Powers of Executive of the model branch by-laws will be amended by rewording subsection (i) to read: "Hold a minimum of three Executive meetings per year."
- In accordance with the policy on Branch Viability Guidelines, the Membership Benefits and Services Committee will initiate a consultative process with the St. Mary's Bay Branch to determine the branch's continued viability.
