- The NLTA will nominate Past-president Sean Noah for the upcoming vacancy as the eastern representative on the Board of Trustees for the CTF Trust Fund for 2010-13.
- The NLTA will continue its sponsorship of the Newspapers in Education Program at the level of \$1,000 for 2009-10.
- The NLTA will contribute the amount of \$5,600, the equivalent of \$1.00 per member, to the Education International Haiti Earthquake Solidarity Fund.
