## Association Priorities

Provincial Executive members were provided with an updated copy of the Association's priorities for 1999-2000. ## Collective Bargaining

The Collective Bargaining Committee has completed its collection of submissions from teachers regarding their concerns, ideas and/or recommendations for a new set of opening proposals. Teachers are still, however, encouraged to have input into the process. A draft of opening proposals will be forwarded to Provincial Executive for review at the September meeting. Provincial Executive and Joint Council will meet in October to review the main priorities and objectives. For the upcoming round of negotiations the Association can serve notice of its desire to reopen as of November 1, 2000. ## Ministerial Panel

Provincial Executive discussed the status of our response to the Ministerial Panel Report on the Delivery of Education in the Classroom. At the present time there has been no feedback from government about our response and no timelines have been put in place on how or when the Panel's recommendations will be actioned. Provincial Executive will put in place a procedure whereby the status of the recommendations are followed up and placed on the agenda at each Executive meeting. This will be actioned as soon as possible. The implementation committee, on which the NLTA is represented, will meet again on June 13 and 14, 2000. ## Business from Standing Committees

### COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COMMITTEE

The NLTA will forward to the Federation of Labour Committee studying the Workplace, Health, Safety and Compensation Commission recommendations that a cap of \$45,500 be removed from WHSCC Act and that there be an increase in the benefit level of an applicant from 80 percent to 100 percent of the initial salary. #### MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS AND SERVICES COMMITTEE

- The NLTA will express to the Faculty of Education the Association's desire to have a Multi-Age/Multi-Grade teaching course as part of the required program for teacher education.
- The NLTA will request to the proper authorities within the Faculty of Education that the Tele-Learning and Rural school teaching program be reviewed to have 4907 –; Curriculum Connections in Multi-Grade/Multi-Age Classrooms and 4912 –; Student Assessment in the Context of Rural Schools included as core courses, replacing 4902 –; Special Needs in the Context of Rural Schools and 4903 –; Leadership Perspectives in Rural Schools which could in turn become elective courses.
- NLTA policy BES 33 #7b will be modified to include Reading Recovery and Later Literacy as follows: "Teachers for speciality program areas such as Physical Education, Music, Core French, Reading Recovery and Later Literacy should be excluded from the normal pupil-teacher allocation ratio."
- Proposed changes to the Branch Restructuring Policy were adopted as presented.

### **Labrador Teaching Conditions**

The costs, conditions and issues facing teachers in Labrador were brought to the attention of Provincial Executive. There are very few incentives or benefits for keeping teachers in Labrador or in rural areas of the province. Teachers are viewed as itinerant because they do not usually stay in the small, rural communities. There is an expected teacher shortage for Labrador for the coming year. President Andrews has been vocal about this issue in the media in all of his recent interviews. This issue will be discussed at the meeting of the Newfoundland and Labrador Association of Directors in Education scheduled for June 25-28 and a decision for action will be taken at that time.
