Collective Bargaining

The Negotiating Team met on May 16-17, May 23-25, and June 5-7. The employer has presented three new positions to the NLTA concerning articles on which the employer had reserved the right to open when the proposals were first exchanged in January. These include Article 28 -- Length of School Year, Schedule C -- Allowances, and Article 20 -- Educational Leave. A written response on each of these proposals has been forwarded to the employer as well as responses on a number of other articles and clauses.

Further talks are scheduled for June 19-20 and an update by way of "Bargaining Briefs" will be provided following those sessions.
