Association Priorities for 2002-03

Labrador Benefits Negotiations

Since May 2002 the Multi-Union Negotiation Team representing provincial

employees in Labrador has been negotiating with the employers and Treasury Board officials in an attempt to improve the Labrador Benefits Agreement. During the sessions held in St. John's from February 24-25, significant movement occurred and a tentative agreement was presented to the membership during the first week of March 2003 with a ratification vote to occur later in the month.

If ratified by the majority of unions party to the agreement, this agreement will be signed to cover the period April 1, 2002 to March 31, 2005.
