Association Priorities

Provincial Executive reviewed the Priorities Document and was updated by Administrative Staff on various elements of the document including objectives, timelines and action updates. Ad Hoc Committee on School Administrators

A meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on School Administrators took place in St. John's in early March. The committee has the mandate to study and make recommendations to Provincial Executive regarding: the structure and role of a School Administrators Council within the NLTA; representatives of school administrators within the NLTA; and NLTA services to school administrators, and the delivery of these services. Several recommendations from the committee were approved

by Provincial Executive in the areas of professional development, administrative services, governance and communication.

Ad Hoc Committee on SIC Restructuring

As stated in the January issue of *Executive Notes*, this committee has the mandate to develop new policies, procedures, by-laws and an implementation strategy to enact the motion from Provincial Executive to change the SIC structure to establish three councils: Primary/Elementary, Intermediate, and High School, while allowing for the continued existence of certain specialized councils.

The committee met again in late March and recommended that, where feasible within the NLTA policy on committees, the membership of the Professional Issues and Curriculum Committee will include representative(s) from special interest council provincial executive. This recommendation was approved by Provincial Executive.
