## **Collective Bargaining**

NLTA served notice the first week of November re: its desire to commence negotiations. A reply has been received from Treasury Board that negotiations will commence as soon as possible. The NLTA Negotiating Team will meet in St. John's the week of November 27 for extensive training and information sessions. It is expected that negotiations will begin in January. Executive will devote time at the January Executive meeting to planning deadlines and strategies for the upcoming round of negotiations with the aim of ensuring that a collective agreement is completed in a timely fashion.

### **CURRICULUM COMMITTEE**

- In addition to responses from Special Interest Councils, feedback will be obtained from Program Implementation Specialists for Primary and Program Implementation Specialists for Literacy/Reading to obtain their reaction to the proposed primary grade time allocations, based upon their own experience, pedagogical considerations, and consultation with teachers and administrators in their districts.
  - The President will write the Minister of Education indicating that NLTA is studying the Department of Education's proposed time allocations for primary grades, in response to some concerns that have been raised, and will consult widely with the field before taking a final position. The letter will request that government delay the implementation of these time allocations until consultation has taken place with the Association and others.
  - The membership will be notified that NLTA is studying the Department of Education's proposed time allocations for primary grades, based upon some concerns which have been raised, and will be developing a position in the near future. As part of this communication, members will be invited to submit their reaction to these proposed changes.
  - NLTA will develop an agreement with the Department of Education, similar to that developed by the NSTU, regarding the APEF questionnaire on Language Arts. The details of the Association's concerns and ensuing conditions will be communicated to the membership prior to administration of the questionnaire.
