The Executive Director updated Provincial Executive on the nine School Representative seminars that were held over three weekends in September and October. The seminars and presentations were well received by teachers who attended and there were many good suggestions and ideas. Association Priorities 1999-2000

As identified in the [August edition](#) of Executive Notes, the four priorities for the Association, on behalf of teachers, for this school year are collective bargaining preparations, membership involvement, curriculum issues, and classroom issues.

Provincial Executive had a detailed discussion on each of these priorities. The priorities of curriculum issues, classroom issues, and membership involvement were also discussed at length during the preparations for and with the Ministerial Panel. Ministerial Panel

The Ministerial Panel met with Provincial Executive for a four hour discussion concerning the position of NLTA on the delivery of education in the classroom. This was a follow up to the meeting in Lewisporte in late August when Provincial Executive was briefed on the focus of the panel.

In preparation of this meeting Provincial Executive and Administrative Staff met for most of the previous day to discuss and finalize a detailed presentation. This presentation was divided into four main discussion areas. They were: programming, delivery, resourcing, and supporting.

A full briefing of the Association's position will be presented to the Joint Council at the November meeting.
