Collective Bargaining

Provincial Executive reviewed the Conciliation Board Report that was received by NLTA on February 10. The following motion was passed by Provincial Executive:

The Executive position on the Conciliation Board Report will be to reject the Report, and that such recommendation will be communicated to the membership.

Joint Council also reviewed the report and unanimously endorsed the motion passed by Provincial Executive. Branch meetings were scheduled for the week of February 18 to inform the membership of the contents of the report and the recommendation from Provincial Executive. A province-wide vote by teachers will take place on Friday, February 22 on the contents of the report.
