Association Priorities for 2002-03

Provincial Executive reviewed the Priorities Document which outlines action plans, who is responsible, target dates for implementation and action updates for the Association. Various Administrative Staff gave updates on sections of the Priorities Document and answered questions from Provincial Executive. The four priorities are: quality of teachers' work life; membership involvement; communications/public relations; teacher accountability/assessment/professionalism/certification.

To date, he has visited almost 220 schools in Newfoundland and Labrador. Many issues have been raised among the teachers in the schools during these visits including workload, new school construction, class size, lack of resources, etc. The President has also attended Executive meetings with the Canadian Teachers' Federation in his role as Vice-President of CTF, attended the launch of the Janeway Miracle Network Telethon, CAPTO Executive meetings in St. John's, attended the Substitute Teachers Special Interest Council meeting, and has done interviews with The Herald re Education Week, and NTV re Janeway Day in the Schools.

PROFESSIONAL ISSUES IN TEACHING COMMITTEE

MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS AND SERVICES COMMITTEE

- Section 5 of the NLTA Policy on Legal Aid was amended to ensure that NLTA policy is consistent with recent changes in the Teacher Certification system of reviews and appeals.
- The policy on the Allan Bishop award was amended so that the deadline date for receipt of nominations at the NLTA office will be January 15 of each year.
- The policy on Pre-retirement Seminars was amended to read "A spouse is welcome to accompany the participating teacher to a pre-retirement seminar, but no expenses will be covered". The word spouse will also be deleted from section 4.b).
- Seven pre-retirement seminars will be held during the Fall of 2003 as per Association policy. The locations are as follows: Gander, Corner Brook, Stephenville, Grand Falls-Windsor, and three in St. John's. The dates and
