Association Priorities

Provincial Executive reviewed the Priorities Document and was updated by Administrative Staff on various elements of the document including objectives, timelines and action updates. The five priorities are: negotiating a collective agreement; teacher accountability/assessment/professionalism; curriculum issues; quality of teachers' work life; and membership awareness.

The Provincial Executive discussed a report from the Negotiating Team concerning its consideration of the current collective bargaining environment. The President will be providing further information to the membership.

Video Conferencing

A presentation was made to Provincial Executive on the work of the Virtual Teacher Centre and the Centre for Distance Learning and Innovation in the area of video conferencing by Alex Hickey and Maurice Barry. The presentation involved video links with the CDLI office in Gander as well as two schools throughout the province. The Association will investigate the use of video conferencing in an effort to secure savings to the Association.

The President updated the Provincial Executive on his activities since the April meeting. Besides his usual activities in his role as President, he also attended the Holocaust Memorial Services sponsored by the Jewish Congregation of Newfoundland and Labrador, the CAPTO Annual Meeting in New Brunswick, the CTF Accountability Conference in Ottawa, the School Administrators AGM and Conference in St. John's, and the CTF Affiliates Presidents' Meeting in Quebec.

The President has also been active in the media on the effects of teacher cuts on students, and participated in the release of the results of [It's About Time: A Report on the Impact of Workload on Teachers and Students](#), at a news conference in early June. He also made a presentation to the Janeway Telethon and has attended various banquets throughout the province in honour of retiring teachers.

Business from Standing Committees

TABLE OFFICERS

- Funding will be provided for the NLTA's share of the cost of operation of the Virtual Teacher Centre for 2004-05.
- The NLTA Electoral Committee for 2004-05 was appointed. They are as follows: Doreen Noseworthy, Holyrood (Chairperson), past Executive Member; Ken Kavanagh, Bell Island, past Executive Member; and Debra Sparkes Mercer, Carbonear, teacher and past Branch President.
- The NLTA will nominate Executive Director Edward Hancock for the position of Trustee on the CTF Trust Fund Board of Trustees and to the CTF Ad Hoc Committee for National Issues in Education.
- The NLTA will nominate Ann Shortall to the CTF Committee on Bisexual, Gay, Lesbian, Transgender and Two-Spirited Issues.
- The Provincial Executive will communicate to the Iron Ore Company of Canada its strongest objections to the unilateral action by the IOCC in drastically reducing the school board education grant in Labrador West, its request for immediate reinstatement of the grant to its 2003-04 level, and its request for an immediate meeting with IOCC representatives on this issue.
- The NLTA will contribute \$1,000 towards the MUN Faculty of Education/Parks Canada Institute for Teacher Interns. This funding will be allocated from the Beginning Teacher Program Support within the PD budget.

COMMITTEE ON EARLY CAREER TEACHERS

The President of the NLTA will write the Minister of Education to express concern re the loss of support to new teachers as programs such as the Teacher Induction Program, previously run through the school districts, are now compromised due to district restructuring, staffing, and transitioning. This letter will also reference the research as to the impact of such support on teacher retention and the implications for loss of early career teachers to the profession.

PROFESSIONAL ISSUES IN TEACHING COMMITTEE

- The NLTA will change the Special Interest Council structure to move toward the establishment of three councils: Primary/Elementary, Intermediate, and High School, while allowing for the continued existence of specialized councils.
- Through the collective bargaining process the NLTA will explore the possibility of establishing a day designated as a common day for Special Interest Council professional development offerings.
- The policy on the NLTA scholarships to students will be amended so that the award will be based on the criteria used by the Department of Education for the selection of provincial scholarship recipients rather than on the scholarship exam.

MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS AND SERVICES
