The NLTA will support an amendment to legislation/regulations that would remove the limit of 65 days for retired teachers only in circumstances where no non-retired substitute teacher capable of filling the position is available.

Educational Leave

Provincial Executive held a timed session to provide feedback to the NLTA representatives on the Educational Leave Committee regarding the process of, and criteria for, providing educational leaves to teachers. Recent changes in the collective agreement giving new funding guidelines for educational leave have meant improved remuneration for those awarded leaves and thus increased

the demand for these leaves. At the same time the number of leaves available has decreased. Provincial Executive discussed these issues and provided feedback to the representatives for their future discussions with the Educational Leave Committee.

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

A presentation was made by Ted Murphy, Chair of the Collective Bargaining Committee re objectives and priorities for the 2004 Opening Package. A total of 576 submission forms were received from teachers that contained recommended priorities for the Opening Package. This presentation included an update on the duration of the agreement, the Teachers' Collective Bargaining Act, NLTA Policy and Legislation re the collective bargaining process, and communications to teachers during negotiations.

AIMS REPORT CARD ON ATLANTIC CANADIAN SCHOOLS

A presentation was made by Dr. Robert Crocker, Atlantic Evaluation and Research Consultants, re the AIMS Report Card on Atlantic Canadian High Schools. Dr. Crocker had prepared a review of the AIMS study in response to a request from the Atlantic Provinces Education Foundation (APEF). The purpose of the review was to critically examine the methodology and data sources used in producing the report, the validity and reliability of the rankings, public and professional response to the report and the AIMS reaction to these responses. Dr. Crocker reviewed this report with Joint Council and examined the conceptual and methodological issues surrounding such reports.
