## **Association Priorities for 2003-04**

At the August Executive meeting Provincial Executive identified priorities for the 2003-04 school year and discussed issues that are expected to predominate activities for the coming school year. At the October meeting Executive reviewed the priorities document which had been further developed by administrative staff in line with the August discussions. Specific objectives have been identified under each priority. Discussion took place on status to date.

The five priorities are: negotiating a collective agreement; teacher accountability/ assessment/ professionalism; curriculum issues; quality of teachers' work life; and membership awareness.

Since the beginning of the President's term of office he has visited a number of schools across the province, taken part in media training, and attended meetings in his role as President. He has done interviews with The Workers Voice magazine, VOXM on the issues of Special Needs students, collective bargaining preparation, school fees, the provincial election, and voiced back to school messages as well as commercials re making education a priority in the provincial election. He participated in a CBC in-studio panel re the debate among the party leaders, was interviewed by CBC concerning teacher supply and demand issues, group insurance trends, and wrote several letters to the editor on education concerns.

## **Collective Bargaining Committee**

The Collective Bargaining Committee reported to Provincial Executive on the status to date of the preparation of an opening package. The draft opening proposals were presented and reviewed for Executive by Ted Murphy, Chair of the Committee, and Perry Downey, Staff Consultant. Items noted by Provincial Executive regarding the opening proposals will be further considered by the Collective Bargaining Committee in the preparation of the final package. The Collective Bargaining Committee will also give consideration to having teacher certification levels and the accompanying salary credit reconfigured to include recognition of approved professional development programs in addition to university-based courses.
