President's Report

The President reported to Provincial Executive on his activities since the June Executive meeting. He made a cheque presentation at the Janeway Telethon, brought greetings to the Newfoundland and Labrador School Boards Association annual meeting, attended several meetings of the CTF Board of Directors, met with the commissioners and vice-commissioners of the Commission to Review the ISSP/Pathways Model and the Commission to Review the Teacher Allocation Model, attended the launch of the Safe and Caring Schools Report, brought greetings to the 3rd Annual Canadian Association of Principals Atlantic Leadership Symposium, and numerous other meetings and presentations in his capacity as President. He continued his school visits through the province and was vocal in the media on back to school issues.

These updates included goals, responsibility, and indicators of progress and success. The priorities are: quality of teachers' work life/contract negotiations; membership awareness; and professionalism/accountability.

Ad Hoc Committee on Substitute Teachers

The following recommendations from the Ad Hoc Committee on Substitute Teachers were accepted by Provincial Executive:

- That the NLTA policy for the hiring of substitute teachers be distributed to all school administrators.

- That school administrators and/or regular teachers shall provide feedback to substitute teachers who are hired to carry out duties in the school.
- That the NLTA pursue its current policy on hiring procedures for substitute teachers during future rounds of negotiations.
- That substitute teachers who are hired into a term or replacement contract be encouraged to request that an evaluation be conducted.
- That school districts be encouraged to invite substitute teachers to school-based and board-based professional development/in-service sessions.
- That school districts be encouraged to cover the cost of travel and meals for substitute teachers wishing to attend professional development/in-service sessions.
- That during district-wide closeout sessions, the district be encouraged to provide relevant professional development/in-service sessions related to the needs of substitute teachers.
- That substitute teachers be provided full access to school board and school website information.
- That all schools be encouraged to develop a regular teacher kit that would be provided to a substitute teacher. The kit would include class lists; daily school schedule; teacher's schedule, including supervision; lists of students with special and/or medical needs; school discipline policy and procedures; fire drill plan and procedure; student assistant name (if applicable); substitute teacher registration form; photocopy access; and any other relevant information that a substitute teacher needs to know.
- That a President's Communiqué be forwarded to all school administrators outlining the concerns and issues raised by substitute teachers during this process: hiring practices; duties; additional supervision; loss of preparation; professional feedback; regular teacher kits; and professional voice.
- That school reps be asked to ensure that information relating to substitute teachers is posted on the NLTA bulletin board in their school.
- A number of other recommendations were current practise/policy of the Association.

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Review of the Teacher Allocation Model

The Commissioner for the Review of the Teacher Allocation Model, Brian Shortall, and Vice-Commissioner Noreen Greene-Fraize, met with Provincial Executive to provide information on its work to date. The Terms of Reference of the Commission were reviewed and the four-phased approach that the Commission will be taking to carry out its mandate. Provincial Executive had the opportunity to raise questions on the process and to make suggestions on the work of the Commission.

An Ad Hoc Committee on Teacher Allocation Review has been established by Provincial Executive. This committee will review the teacher allocation issue and make representation to the Commission.

An Ad Hoc Committee on the ISSP/Pathways Review has been established by Provincial Executive. The committee will provide feedback to the Commission on the challenges of special education programming using the ISSP process and Pathways to Programming and Graduation.
