



# Executive Notes

## President's Report

President Sean Noah has attended numerous meetings in his capacity as President including the CTF Board of Directors Meeting and AGM, CONTACT, several events for retiring teachers, and brought greetings to the AGMs of the NL Association of Directors of Education and the NL School Boards Association. He has presented Special Recognition Awards to teacher recipients, attended the recognition ceremony for Prime Ministers Awards for Teaching Excellence recipients, presented the award to the 2008 NLTA Medal recipient, and participated in the wreath laying at the War Memorial on July 1.

The President has continued school visits throughout the province. He has been active in the media on provincial negotiations, the teacher allocation model, professional development/in-service days, cyberbullying, and awards for teachers.

als to Branch Presidents and allow for a detailed explanation of same, in preparation for the branch meetings to follow. This special Joint Council meeting is scheduled for Saturday, October 4 at the Holiday Inn in St. John's. Branch meetings are being planned to take place within 2-3 weeks after the Joint Council meeting.

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## Update on Recommendations of ISSP/Pathways Report

A presentation was made to Provincial Executive by Dan Goodyear, Director of Student Support Services, and Sandra Taylor, Program Specialist, both with the Department of Education providing an update of progress and activity on recommendations of the ISSP/Pathways Report. The update included information on the child/youth profiles; the model of allocating special education teachers; on-line resource of alternate courses; assessment materials; inclusive education policy; provisions of special education services to students in French Immersion; the appeals process for families; as well as other information on the recommendations.
